I want to thank everyone who came out to celebrate the 4th with us! It was a great time! A big thank you to Stephanie, our event coordinator, and all her volunteers and lake workers for setting up the event. A big shout out to Tim Pulliam for stepping in and running the DJ booth! Pat and Jeff have restocked the bait shop from the 4th of July sales and have numerous reels on a mid-summer sale. With the water levels up, our shore structure is attracting nice catfish during the day and night bites. Cut bait and shrimp are the hot baits now. We had a small crappie run last week with fishermen using minnows. Seems they were gathering under the floating docks. We ask if you are fishing overnight, please separate your creel after midnight to start the next day's creel count. Do this by placing your previous day's creel in a cooler, cleaning the fish on our cleaning station. This by the way is open all night Friday and Saturday night. Tell the ranger what you are doing with your fish. This enables the rangers to keep a more accurate count of what we need to order to restock the lake. Also please adhere to the size limit on our fish. We want to also remind you that if a member gives you a fish, that fish will become part of your creel count. The rangers will be looking at your fish for both size and creel numbers. We are building a quality lake with structure, forage fish and stocking for all members to enjoy!
